The Alhambra Educational Foundation, a non-profit corporation, was founded in 1993 for the purpose of raising funds to support the educational programs for students in the Alhambra Unified School District (AUSD). The Foundation will sponsor the tuition-based summer schools for elementary and high school students. The Foundation works closely with the school district staff to create a program appropriate for meeting the needs of our students. We are offering classes that are academically challenging, student oriented, and fun! Our classes compliment the regular AUSD program. This year our summer program for the elementary and middle school students will be held from:

**June 22 – July 30, a six week, 4-day-a-week program (Tuesday - Friday)
at
Ynez School in Monterey Park**

Classes will be filled on a first-come first-served basis. Applications will be available in the office of all elementary schools in the district. Residence in the AUSD is not required for participation. Students from other districts are invited to apply. Students **not** already enrolled in an AUSD school must provide their immunization record at the time of enrollment.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Students must be registered based on the grade they will be entering in September 2010.

- Enrollment is first come, first served.
- Use the registration form provided.
- Classes can be added if enrollment indicates a need.
- Classes will be cancelled if they do not meet minimum enrollment.
- Avoid registration delays by providing alternate course selections.
- A parent and/or guardian must sign the registration form.
- Students will not be registered until the tuition payment has been processed by the AEF office.

Late Registration By Mail

- A \$15 late fee will be applied to all registrations postmarked or received after May 3, 2010.
- Registration will be based upon class availability.
- Registrations postmarked or received after May 3, 2010 will be held until class enrollment can be confirmed.

Confirmation of Registration

A letter confirming your student's class schedule will be mailed prior to the start of school.

Alternate Class Selections

Choosing alternate course selections can avoid delays in scheduling. Students will automatically be scheduled in their alternate choice should their 1st choice be full or cancelled. If an alternate choice is not provided, a delay in scheduling will occur until a parent and/or guardian can be contacted.

Cancelled Classes

Classes must meet minimum enrollment. Parents and/or guardians will be notified if a scheduled class is cancelled and have the option to select another available class or request a refund for tuition of the cancelled class.

Tuition Payments

- All fees are due at time of registration.
- Check/Money Orders should be made payable to Alhambra Educational Foundation.
- Visa, Master Card and American Express are the only credit cards accepted.
- A \$25 service fee will be charged for all returned checks.

Refunds

AEF offers fee for service programs based on confirmed registration. Our refund policy is applied uniformly.

- Only a parent or guardian can request a refund.
- All refund requests must be made by written request to the Alhambra Educational Foundation office located at 1515 West Mission Road in Alhambra.

- Late fees, processing fees and service charge fees are not refundable.

“Math Workshop”**8:30 – 10:30**

By the end of 7th grade, students need to develop the mastery of arithmetic and be ready to take algebra in 8th grade. This class will focus on developing the fluency in number sense and operations, applying geometric formulas in context, Pythagorean theorem, data organization, graphic and symbolic representations of numeric patterns exploring linear functions and bridging arithmetic to algebra. (\$200)

“Science Adventure”**8:30 – 10:30**

Scientific inquiry lab based activities and projects will be highlighted. Students will be challenged with activities focusing on meaningful questions and careful investigations. Fun and interesting science activities and hands-on experiments are planned. Students will develop their own questions and perform investigations appropriate with their grade level. (\$200)

This class is designed for students who need additional support in reading. This class will utilize a variety of materials to improve the student’s decoding, vocabulary, and comprehension skills. If you are having difficulty reading your social studies and science books, this class is for you. Your grades in other subjects should improve. (\$200)

Technology (Grades 4 – 8)**“Presentation Graphics”****8:30 – 10:30**

Students will learn how to make their projects, posters, and overall look of their schoolwork better, through proper layout, use of color, lettering, and more. The class will also focus on the common skills that students need to get better grades in high school and college. Students will be able to wow their teachers and classmates by adding just that little extra. (\$200)

“Beginning - Intermediate Computer”**8:30 – 10:30**

Students will learn keyboarding skills (typing). The class will cover basic word processing, desktop publishing and Internet research skills. Students will learn how to navigate the Internet, complete searches for information, find what they need, and learn to tell the difference between truth and lies on the Internet. (\$200)

Students will learn how to give digital presentations using Microsoft PowerPoint. The class will cover website design and learn how to keep it up-to-date. Students will learn how to tell the difference between truth and lies on the Internet and learn how to complete web searching to get the information they want. (\$200)

“Robotics – Beginning” (Grades 5 – 8)**8:30 – 10:30**

This class is an exciting introduction to the world of Robotics, where students will learn mechanical design, construction, programming and teamwork skills. Students will also build different robots and program them with a computer to move, react and make sounds to solve challenges. (\$200 plus a \$20 lab fee)

“Robotics – Intermediate/Advance” (Grades 5 – 8)**8:30 – 10:30**

This class introduces intermediate/advance level topics in building and programming robots. Students will practice mechanical design, construction, programming and teamwork skills. As a team member, students will build several robot models and use a computer to program their robots to move, and react in order to solve challenges. (\$200 plus a \$20 lab fee)

Let your artistic side go wild this summer! This is a fun class where students will work with watercolor, tempera paint, oil pastel, paper mache, and other mediums. Students will be exposed to a variety of drawing techniques that can be applied to their studies at school. Then at the end of the summer you will have a chance to show off your creativity. (\$200)

“Visual and Performing Arts and Physical Fitness

This class will instruct students in all disciplines of visual and performing arts and in the benefits of maintaining a healthy body and life style. In dance, students will learn how to create and perform in dance. Students will also develop focus, concentration, and rhythm while learning a variety of dance forms. In drama, students will improve acting skills by exploring voice, facial expressions and gestures in short theatrical scenes. In chorus, students will improve listening and singing skills with rhythms, melody, and harmony. In visual arts, students will learn the elements of art, such as line, shape texture, color and form. Students will apply these elements and their imagination to create and variety of art projects using different materials and techniques. In physical fitness, students will learn stretching and breathing exercises and exercises to develop upper and lower body strength. (\$200 per session)

AFTERNOON CLASSES AT ALHAMBRA HIGH SCHOOL

“Advanced String Orchestra” 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm Location: Alhambra High School Course #601

The class will concentrate on more advanced string pieces. Techniques, such as Spicatto, double-stops, and others, will be introduced. Playing in tune as a group will be reinforced and ear-training exercises will be used to that effect. (\$50)

“Middle School Band” 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm Location: Alhambra High School Course #602

All musicians should have one year of playing experience on brass, woodwind, or percussion instruments. Guitarist, who can read music, tabs, or chord diagrams are also welcome. (\$50)

“Beginning Band” 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm Location: Alhambra High School Course #603

Learn how to play a band instrument this summer! You will learn to play everything from flute, clarinet, and saxophone in the woodwind family to trumpet, trombone, French horn, and tuba in the brass family. You will also learn drums. If you complete this class, you can play in your school band in the fall. (\$50)

“Beginning Strings” 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm Location: Alhambra High School Course #604

Learn how to play a string instrument this summer. You will learn to play the violin, viola, cello, or string bass. If you complete this class, you can play in school string group in the fall. (\$50)
